Dr. Campling, Psy.D has over 20 years experience in the field of mental health and addiction treatment. She is degreed in both nursing and psychology and has worked in a variety of settings including outpatient mental health care and most recently, as the Director of the Keystone Center ECU in Chester, Pa. She was also founder and Director of their Professional Assessment Center and has considerable experience facilitating recovery for health care providers and clergy.

Campling obtained a Doctorate from LaSalle University in Philadelphia, Pa., and a bachelor's degree in nursing from Alvernia University in Reading, Pa. She has served on the Advisory Board for IITAP and Alvernia University graduate psychology programs and supervised both interns and post doctorate fellows including graduates of Widener University's JD/Psy.D program. She is a Certified Sexual Addictions Therapist-Supervisor, Certified Domestic Violence Therapist, Certified Sexual Offender Therapist and an Administrator for the Abel Assessment of Sexual Interest. Dr. Campling has presented extensively on the topics of sexual addiction, sexual offending, domestic violence and trauma.

Dr. Stephen Howard, MD, is an experiential psychotherapist, family therapist, and psychiatrist with over 40 years of clinical practice. He is dedicated to sharing that experience and wisdom through continuing education for therapists and counselors. He supervises and writes extensively, and presents regular Continuing Education workshops.

Directions to Parking Lot of The Coastal Georgia Center

From I-16 East:

- Exit onto Martin Luther King, Jr. Blvd. (Turn left at traffic light off exit)
- Continue to next light, Louisville Road (Turn left)
- Continue to next light, Boundary Street (Turn right)
- Continue under old railroad trestle/bridge (Turn immediately to the right)
- This is the entrance to the CGC parking lot.
- CGC is at the red brick building at the top of the hill (SCAD Dorm is on the left)

FROM SOUTH CAROLINA (U.S. 17)

- Take US 17 South Over the Savannah Bridge toward Savannah
- Take 1st exit off the bridge onto Oglethorpe Street
- Turn **RIGHT** @ traffic light onto Fahm Street
- Straight 2 blocks - dead ends into Coastal Georgia Center (parking to the right)

Or

- Take US 17 South Over the Savannah Bridge toward Savannah
- Take 1st exit off the bridge onto Oglethorpe Street
- Take the first right, Boundary Street
- Continue straight 1½ blocks and turn left into the CGC parking lot

CGC is at the red brick building at the top of the hill (SCAD Dorm is on the left)
